WASHINGTON, Sept. 3.—President Eisenhower minimized today the military significance of the Soviet Union's claim that it had successfully tested an intercontinental ballistic missile.

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Washington Studies Little Rock Dispute

WASHINGTON, Sept. 3.—President Eisenhower today directed the Justice Department to keep in close touch today with the school integration dispute in Little Rock, Ark. But there were no plans for Federal intervention.

Officials took the position that it was neither legally possible nor politically desirable for the Executive branch of the Government to step in at this stage. They said the next move was up to the Federal district judge sitting in the case, Ronald N. Davies.

Later tonight Judge Davies ordered integration in the Little Rock school to proceed forthwith.

President Eisenhower had responded to the crisis from Little Rock at his news conference.

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
